Over 400 of you volunteered, lending your valuable time.



You helped Kathryn and Jason's family build the "foundation for a second chance"



Looking at Kathryn and Jason in their cozy new apartment with their happy children, you'd never know that just a short time ago, the family was facing serious challenges and found themselves unhoused.

Kathryn was eight months pregnant when they visited the Haven's Community Food Market. There, Kathryn met Gwen, Haven Community Service Coordinator, who told Kathryn about all the services available to people needing a helping hand.

Their family found safety in the Byrne Family Shelter, but their struggles weren't over. Kathryn and Jason temporarily lost custody of their children as Jason sought treatment for substance misuse. "I really gave up at that point," recalls Jason.

But because of your dedicated support of the Haven, Kathryn and Jason were empowered to take control of their situation and learned to trust the Haven's staff and services. With Jason in treatment and Kathryn living at the Hixon adult shelter, they both continued to find stability as Haven Service Coordinators helped them reunite with their children.

We are excited to share big news with you! The Haven is publicly announcing the 608 North Main Street Capital Campaign.

Capital funds raised in this campaign will help us construct a 9,000 square foot adult shelter and Resource Center to serve your most vulnerable neighbors. Once complete, 608 North Main will allow us to provide over 5,000 safe, warm bed nights to an estimated 100 people annually.

Breaking ground this spring and opening one year later, 608 North Main will operate on harm reduction principles, utilizing our holistic approach to addressing homelessness regardless of sobriety, identification, pet ownership, and other typical barriers to shelter.

Friends like you are essential to the success of 608 North Main Street. This new project will require more of the Haven's time, staff, and funding. Your generosity to the Haven and those we serve helps us provide essential, lifesaving resources to our clients free of charge. We look forward to partnering with you on this incredible opportunity for the Upper Valley—stay tuned!

Brie, who helped them navigate the challenges of finding permanent housing. Brie encouraged Kathryn and Jason to apply through longtime Haven partner Twin **Pines Housing Trust** and helped them obtain a housing voucher to reduce their rent to a manageable amount.

Now in their new home, Kathryn and Jason use what they learned from the Haven to continue to build stability and move forward.

"They help everybody," Kathryn says of the Haven. "It's not just food, like I originally thought. They help with housing, bills, afterschool programs. The

Haven is there for you."

Your kindness multiplies: Dave & Mystic tell everyone about the Haven!

Dave and his beloved dog, Mystic, have a long history of finding judgment-free help through the Haven's shelters, Community Service Coordinators, and lifesaving resources.

Throughout his years of being unhoused, winters have been the hardest. Now Dave and Mystic utilize the Lebanon Seasonal shelter, a warm, safe space to sleep, shower, and escape the frigid nights. Since opening on January 8th, the Lebanon Seasonal Shelter has been full, serving 14 individuals (and a few pets) each night.

Warm shelter is just one of the Haven's many resources Dave has found helpful. When he or Mystic face health issues, need food, a shower, or even a little financial help when his disability check is stretched too thin, he always finds the uplifting, compassionate support he needs at the Haven.

Dave sees firsthand how far a little kindness and respect can take someone-thanks to your generosity and support of the Haven.

"When someone doesn't have a lot of money, I let them know about Hixon House, the Byrne Family Shelter, the Community Food Market," Dave says. "The Haven has so many resources to act as a stepping stone for people who need a helping hand."
